# NETAJI'S FREEDOM STRUGGLE RECALLED

## Calcutta Observes Azad Hind Govt. Anniversary

The anniversary of the Proclamation of the Provisional Government of Azad Hind, founded by Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in East Asia ten years ago on Oct. 21, was observed in Calcutta on Wednesday.

Through meetings and processions the people recalled with gratitude the invaluable contributions of Netaji to the cause of India's freedom struggle.

A pictorial exhibition depicting the various phases of the Azad Hind movement was open to the public from 8 in the morning till 8 in the evening at Netaji Bhawan in South Calcutta. A programme of physical feats and open air dances by children were gone through there on the occasion.

Founded by Netaji, the Mahajati Sadan was also decorated with lights and there was a display of fireworks there in the night. A

A life-size portrait of Netaji, adorned with garlands, was placed on the first floor of the building brilliantly illuminated.

#### NETAJI BHAWAN

A pictorial exhibition depicting the various phases of the formation of the Provisional Government of Azad Hind in East Asia was held in observance of the historic day at Netaji Bhawan.

The exhibition which drew people throughout the day from all parts of the city portrayed Netaji's activities in Europe and the great role he played in the formation of the Azad Hind Government. The exhibition, arranged in a room on the ground floor of the Bhawan, will remain open to the public till Sunday next from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.

On the occasion Netaji's rooms at the Bhawan were thrown open to the public from 8 in the morning till 8 at night and a large number of people visited the rooms to pay their tributes of love and respect to the great leader. The Sarat Bose room at the Bhawan also remained open to the public on the day.

#### PROCESSION FROM HAZRA PARK

In celebration of the occasion a procession, headed by a band, was taken out in the afternoon from Hazra Park. The processionists carried flags and banners and shouted slogans occasionally. After parading through different thoroughfares in South Calcutta the procession terminated at Deshapriya Park where a public meeting was held. The procession was organised by some Leftist parties.

#### NETAJI PARK

Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's service and sacrifice for the cause of the country were recalled at a meeting held at Netaji Park, opposite Mahajati Sadan, on Wednesday. Srimati Lila Roy, presided.

Addressing the meeting Sri Hemendra Prasad Ghose said that it was a matter of shame that the Mahajati Sadan building, as conceived by Netaji, had not yet been completed. This was no credit to the Government of the land or to the people of the country.

Dr. Prafulla Chandra Ghose said that Netaji was a true revolutionary. The freedom Netaji fought for had not yet been won.

Dr. Suresh Chandra Banerjee said that Netaji was imbued with the idea of establishing democratic socialism in a free India.

Netaji's message in life was to unite all divergent forces in the service of the motherland, remarked Sri Naresh Nath Mookerjee, Mayor of Calcutta.

The president Srimati Lila Roy said that the establishment of Azad Hind Fouz and Azad Hind Government infused a new spirit among the people and intensified their urge for freedom. This was chiefly the reason behind Britishers quitting the Indian soil.

Earlier, a bust of Netaji was garlanded by Srimati Roy, Mayor Sri Mookerjee and Dr. Banerjee placed wreaths on the martyrs' column.

#### DESHAPRIYA PARK

A public meeting was held at Deshapriya Park under the auspices of the Azad Hind Government Foundation Day Celebration Committee on Wednesday. Prof. Meghnad Saha, M.P., presiding.

Paying high tributes to the great dynamic personality of Subhas Chandra Bose Prof. Saha observed that no greater ideal than Netaji's could be found anywhere in the world: He said they had no need to borrow any ideal from Russia, China or England. It could be found in Netaji's life, he added.

Prof. Saha in his speech suggested compilation of a full and thorough biography of Netaji by men who knew him personally or worked with him.

Sri Hemanta Kumar Bose narrated the heroic exploits of Netaji leading to the establishment of the Provisional Azad Hind Government 10 years back. Sri Bose demanded a full enquiry into the alleged death of Netaji by the Government of India.

Sri Amiya Nath Bose said that the heroic battle fought by the Azad Hind Fouz for the country's freedom had created a stir in the British Indian Army. There was the mutiny of the ratings at Bombay. When the British authorities found a spirit of rebellion among the Army personnel they began to think of quitting India. For political power and giddy the Congress leaders also betrayed the country, he alleged.

Sri Bose appealed to all Leftist leaders to form a mighty united socialist organisation to end the Congress misrule in India.

Sri Mohit Kumar Moltra read out the first proclamation of the Government of Azad Hind.

Sri Tridiv Chowdhury, M.P., paid tributes to the great leader, Netaji, and urged all Leftist parties to unite to fight for real freedom and economic emancipation of the people.

Sri Debnath Das demanded that the Government of India should immediately set up an Investigation Commission to enquire into the alleged death of Netaji.

Major Satya Gupta also spoke.

#### AZAD HIND BAGH

An appeal to follow Netaji's ideal was made by different speakers addressing a public meeting at Azad Hind Bagh (Hedua) on Wednesday afternoon.

Sri Santosh Kumar Basu, who presided said that there was no man in this country who did not love and respect Netaji who dedicated himself for the liberation of his motherland.

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Netaji formed the Azad Hind Government in a distant land to drive away the foreigners from India. Today India was free and some of his co-workers were at the helm of the Government of free India. Although India was free now she had been passing through a crisis. The primary duty of the young men of the country should be to make it prosperous and that would be the greatest tribute to Netaji, he added. Prof. Manindra Chakraverty said that for his spirit of patriotism and sacrifice Netaji would ever remain alive in the hearts of the people of India. Prof. Jiten Ghose also spoke.

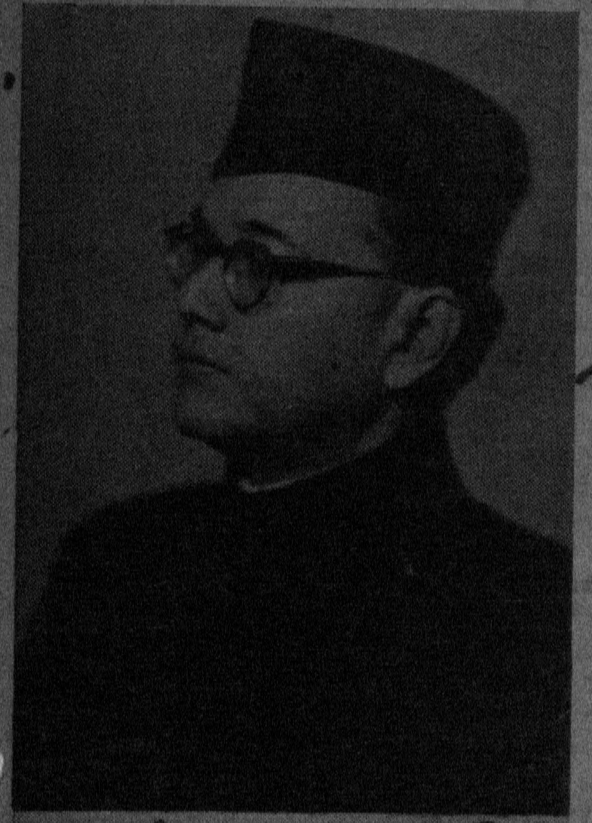

LONDON: The British Government is rumoured to be very much perturbed over confidential information that has come into its possession, quite recently, that Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, the great Indian revolutionary leader and head of the famous INA resistance movement, is alive and awaiting the right opportunity to return to his Homeland.

This sensational news upsetting the wishful thinking of many who believed that Bose died in a plane crash while on his way from Rangoon to Tokio was originally transmitted to the British Foreign Office from the British Embassy in Turkey and is reported to have been confirmed since from Anglo-American secret agents in the East.

PLANE CRASH STORY UNCONFIRMED: It is not known whether news of the Living Bose is based upon positive evidence of his whereabouts - suspected to be in Red China or Soviet Russia, or upon what is described as the "negative" evidence of the failure of the best brains of the Anglo-American security services to dig up the slightest evidence in confirmation of the story of Bose's death in a plane crash and his subsequent cremation with full military honours in Tokio.

That story, it will be remembered, owed its origin exclusively to a somewhat confusing statement made by General Habib-ur-Rahman, Chief of Netaji's personal staff, who claimed that he was with Bose in the plane when it crashed. It is significant that, after giving various contradictory stories about the crash, Rahman, who is now with the raiders in Kashmir, has finally given expression to his belief that Netaji is alive and will return.

Anglo-American sources, haunted by the bogey of the Red Peril, seem to see the hand of Bose behind every Communist offensive in South-East Asia and the Far East. They seem to have decided that the Indian leader is presently undergoing training in Russia to emerge as another Tito, Dimitrov or Mao, when the Marxist hour strikes for India.

A sensational report about Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's escape has been published in 'Jugantar' on 6.3.69 on page-5, in which a police officer of the Govt. of W. Bengal who served the Armed Force of the Govt. of India at the time of War at Singapore, is said to have disclosed a hitherto unknown fact about Netaji. It was so far known that Netaji left Singapore by a plane for Taihoko in Formosa but the said policeman claimed from his personal knowledge that he instead boarded on a Jap submarine at Singapore with two Japanese officers at the time of surrender by Japan. He also claimed that Netaji left his sword with him which he brought to India with the help of late Air Marshall Subrata Mukherji.

This report, if true, throws a wholly new light on the episode of Netaji's escape from Singapore after the War. I hope you will consider the matter as very important and make an enquiry about the report published in Jugantar. You would kindly let me know the name of the said police officer and his address and also the report of your enquiry regarding the news.
